



Float-farming demonstration

Climate resilient regenerative organic agriculture through float-farming and its adaptive integration with aquaculture in flood-inundated areas is a key approach in Begusarai, Bihar. This initiative aims to include activities in capacity building for technology adoption, financial inclusion, and market linkages to foster entrepreneurship development. The primary purpose of these floats is to enable farmers to cultivate crops in growbags on floating structures, thus generating income from areas otherwise left unused due to flooding. This approach is being implemented in two Bihar villages, Kanwar Jheel, the only Ramsar site in Bihar, and Kharagpur, by CACs-IITM and PFRI in collaboration with SAFE and UNDP, and is supported by IndusInd Bank.
